My name is Torie Cortez. I am the publisher and managing editor of Dismal Freedom Press, an independent investigative newsroom covering education, civil rights, and community issues across California's Central Valley, and a Lathrop-area parent.

I am writing to invite the Lathrop Parks, Recreation & Maintenance Services Department to co-present a free community Bike and Traffic Safety Education Event on Saturday, May 17, 2026 — the final day of National Bike to Work Week and during National Bicycle Safety Month.

I submitted a formal request to Mayor Paul Akinjo and the full City Council on March 23, 2026, requesting use of the City Hall parking lot at 390 Towne Centre Dr for this event. - Lathrop PD community outreach participation
- Full editorial coverage by Dismal Freedom Press
